

PLRS Course Descriptions

****CTS** courses are module based. Each module is worth one credit. Students are expected to complete 3 modules per course for 3 credits but may earn more.

Aboriginal Studies: Students explore the traditions, culture of the plains Cree People and basic Cree language.

(CTS) Agriculture: A focus on agricultural basics in regards to plants and animals.

Art: Students will have the opportunity to work with charcoal, acrylics and pastels to create works of art. Students can check the front section if they would like to take a 5 credit Art everyday (Dependent on numbers)

(CTS) Computers - Media Studies: This course focuses on different forms of media, such as digital photography, video and music technology.

(CTS) Computer Science: This course focuses on the art and science of computer programming. Students will learn basic concepts and terminology and work their way towards computer programming.

(CTS) Cosmetology: This course exposes students to a range of hair care, esthetics, and personal styling lessons. (\$20.00)

(CTS) Coaching and Officiating: Students learn basic coaching and officiating skills in the areas of planning and delivering a practice, teaching and learning, and mental skills training. Students will have the opportunity to earn coaching and officiating credentials.

(CTS) Design Studies: This course provides the student with practical, hands-on experience producing a variety of signage using traditional and high-tech methods. (\$20.00)

(CTS) Financial Management and Entrepreneurship: This course has 2 key components: 1) Personal Finance- provides you with the skills to manage money by learning to budget, save, and invest. 2) Entrepreneurship- learn to launch your own venture, finance, market, and run your own small business.

(CTS) Foods: You may sign up for only 2 sections of Foods. The emphasis in Foods is on the development of knowledge of skills in the safe and sanitary preparation of a variety of snacks and foods, baking and creating meals. (\$20.00)

Fashions: In Fashions students are expected to provide their own fabric, patterns, and notions for chosen projects. (\$20.00)

Film Studies: Module based, students will learn thematic techniques used in media.

Forensic Science 25: The prerequisite for signing up is a passing mark in Science 10 or Science 14.

(CTS) Leadership: This class provides opportunity to be involved in school projects. (Yearbook, PLRS TV, Activity Days)

(CTS) Mechanics, Construction, Fabrication, CTS: All Industrial Arts projects involve additional costs for materials. (\$20.00)

(CTS) Outdoor Education: Experience the great outdoors and learn about human interaction and the environment.

Physical Education 10/CALM 20: These courses are required for graduation. The 8 credit course will have P.E every day and focus on competitive and non-competitive games and on active living.

Physical Education 20/30: This course will include a field trip which may require additional payment. Students can check the front if they would like to take the class in both semesters for 5 credits. (Dependent on numbers)

(CTS) Sports Injury and Rehabilitation: Students learn about injury management and physical rehabilitation (\$20.00)

(CTS) Sport Performance: The class will look at human anatomy and the role of exercise. There is an opportunity to use and receive education about the weight room in this course.

(CTS) Wildlife: This class involves learning about interactions with wildlife. The class will be focused on responsible outdoor activities with minimal impact on the environment.

World Religions 30: This class will discuss the meaning and development of major world religions as well as the basic beliefs and practices of those religions

Special Notes:

Chemistry 20 in grade 10: Minimum 65% in Science 10 and 75% in Chemistry unit. (Teacher recommendation)

Chemistry 30 in grade 11: 70% in Chemistry 20 (Teacher recommendation).

Physics 30: co. rec. Math 30-1 or 30-2
