3. 47000 home fires in the United States are caused by an electrical failure or malfunction
4. Overloaded electrical circuits frequently cause such fires
5. Never use extension cords or power strips for appliances
6. All major appliances should be plugged directly into a wall receptacle outlet
7. Only one heat-producing appliance should be plugged into a receptacle outlet
8. Heavy reliance on extension cords or power strips must be avoided
9. Power strips only add additional outlets; they do not change the amount of power being received from an outlet; do not overload an outlet
